the myths of the inca gods in the first section of the book explain how the world was created and also detail the adventures of various deities as they vie for supremacy or act as tricksters in the worlds of mortals and huacas alike

did the inca have superhuman powers stories that jesus ruiz heard about his ancestors were just that until he made a discovery that changed everything his studies while attending the university of arizona led him to ancient documents we learn about shaman ancient messages in weavings quipu and our dna we learn how to talk to the gods a beautiful library student working on her phd covertly helps jesus and later their paths merge while searching for records created by scribes during the inca conquest their study leads to the archives of the indies in spain the vatican gods of human creation ancient aliens and beyond the god sach amama leads them to hidden artifacts and jesus embarks on an exciting quest for clues that transport him back to the beginning where he uncovers ancient hidden truths about the incas and their supernatural powers he and his new friends set out on an eye opening journey through history fantasy and time using the powerful secret keys of his homeland to defeat an evil threat long ago the gods gave people superhuman powers when it is time they will give those who earn it the knowledge and understanding that will allow them to survive it s use

inca myths were primarily a diffuse and fragmentary oral tradition eventually preserved in writing only in a piecemeal fashion in this volume a leading andean scholar reviews the sources of our current knowledge of inca mythology

completed in 1653 father bernabe cobo s historia del nuevo mundo is an important source of information on pre conquest and colonial spanish america though parts of the work are now lost the remaining sections which have been translated offer valuable insights into inca culture and peruvian history inca religion and customs is the second translation by roland hamilton from cobo s massive work beginning where history of the inca empire left off it provides a vast amount of data on the religion and lifeways of the incas and their subject peoples despite his obvious christian bias as a jesuit priest cobo objectively and thoroughly describes many of the religious practices of the incas he catalogs their origin myths beliefs about the afterlife shrines and objects of worship sacrifices sins festivals and the roles of priests sorcerers and doctors the section on inca customs is equally inclusive cobo covers such topics as language food and shelter marriage and childrearing agriculture warfare medicine practical crafts games and burial rituals because the incas apparently had no written language such postconquest documents are an important source of information about inca life and culture cobo s work written by one who wanted to preserve something of the indigenous culture that his fellow spaniards were fast destroying is one of the most accurate and highly respected

only a few decades after the spanish conquest of peru the third bishop of cuzco sebastián de lartaún called for a report on the religious practices of the incas the report was prepared by cristóbal de molina a priest of the hospital for the natives of our lady of succor in cuzco and preacher general of the city molina was an outstanding quechua speaker and his advanced language skills allowed him to interview the older indigenous men of cuzco who were among the last surviving eyewitnesses of the rituals conducted at the height of inca rule thus molina s account preserves a crucial first hand record of inca religious beliefs and practices this volume is the first english translation of molina s relación de las fábulas y ritos de los incas since 1873 and includes the first authoritative scholarly commentary and notes the work opens with several inca creation myths and descriptions of the major gods and shrines huacas molina then discusses the most important rituals that occurred in cuzco during each month of the year as well as rituals that were not tied to the ceremonial calendar such as birth rituals female initiation rites and marriages molina also describes the capacocha ritual in which all the shrines of the empire were offered sacrifices as well as the taqui ongoy a millennial movement that spread across the andes during the late 1560s in response to growing spanish domination and accelerated violence against the so called idolatrous religions of the andean peoples

the epic story of the fall of the inca empire to spanish conquistador francisco pizarro in the aftermath of a bloody civil war and the recent discovery of the lost guerrilla capital of the incas vilcabamba by three american explorers in 1532 the fifty four year old spanish conquistador francisco pizarro led a force of 167 men including his four brothers to the shores of peru unbeknownst to the spaniards the inca rulers of peru had just fought a bloody civil war in which the emperor atahualpa had defeated his brother huascar pizarro and his men soon clashed with atahualpa and a huge force of inca warriors at the battle of cajamarca despite being outnumbered by more than two hundred to one the spaniards prevailed due largely to their horses their steel armour and swords and their tactic of surprise they captured and imprisoned atahualpa although the inca emperor paid an enormous ransom in gold the spaniards executed him anyway the following year the spaniards seized the inca capital of cuzco completing their conquest of the largest native empire the new world has ever known peru was now a spanish colony and the conquistadors were wealthy beyond their wildest dreams but the incas did not submit willingly a young inca emperor the brother of atahualpa soon led a massive rebellion against the spaniards inflicting heavy casualties and nearly wiping out the conquerors eventually however pizarro and his men forced the emperor to abandon the andes and flee to the amazon there he established a hidden capital called vilcabamba only recently rediscovered by a trio of colorful american explorers although the incas fought a deadly thirty six year long guerrilla war the spanish ultimately captured the last inca emperor and vanquished the native resistance

originally published in 1901 the following description comes from the first edition this work although of a scientific nature has not been written exclusively for scientists for the theme is of so universal a scope as to be worthy the attention of all who are concerned in lessening the trials of humanity or who wish to shape the necessities of life through a more useful and consequently a more happy being centuries before the introduction of cocaine to anaesthetic uses the world had been amazed by accounts of the energy creating properties ascribed to a plant intimately associated with the rites and customs of the ancient peruvians and first made known through the chroniclers of spanish conquest in america the history of this plant known as coca is the history of the incan race and is entwined throughout the associations of the vast socialistic empire of those early people of peru the characteristics and botanical peculiarities of coca and the economic uses of plants of the family to which it belongs are described and an effort is made to harmonize the early uses of the substance which are now shown to be of necessity and not of luxury with its present employment through facts of modern physiology no effort has been made to make this work in any sense a book of coca therapy but a study of the early necessities and the hypothesis here advanced as to the rationale of its empirical uses will doubtless be ample to impress the true status of coca and will suggest its application in the affairs of modern life for conditions similar to those which originally demanded
